### THE NETWORK:

The ASSITEJ Small Countries Network was founded in 2021, aiming at bringing together ASSITEJ National Centres and affiliates from countries with a population of less than 1,000,000 inhabitants, which face the same challenges and opportunities. The Network consists of the ASSITEJ National Centres from Cyprus, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg and Montenegro, as well as the ASSITEJ Affiliate from San Marino (Bradipoteatar). The Network's conference is organised every year in a different country, together with a professional programme for emerging artists from the small countries of Europe.

#### **ASSITEJ CYPRUS**

ASSITE Cyprus is interested in the rights of the child, with a focus on cultural rights. Its activities are looking both inwards, through the promotion of theatre for young audiences in Cyprus, as well as outwards, through international collaborations. They include workshops, campaigns, exchanges and advocacy activities. The Centre organised the first edition of the Mitsikouri International Performing Arts Festival for Children and Young People in October and November 2024.

ASSITEJ in Iceland is run by and for professionals in performance art for young audiences. The Centre hosts a biennale festival - UNGI (Chick) and it also runs EGGID (The Egg), a programme of encounters and workshops for artists in the field.
