THE NORWEGIAN ASSITEJ FESTIVAL

The Norwegian Assitej Festival is the most important meeting point between the Norwegian and the international field of theatre for young audiences.

The festival has been held in Kristiansand since 1993, for the most part as a biennale. The festival is owned and organized by Assitej Norway. In 2015, the festival was renamed SAND Festival and became an annual festival. In 2021, we are returning to the old name: The Norwegian Assitej Festival.

AAG2019: TOWARDS THE UNKNOWN – CONFRONTING THE PRESENT

AAG2019 was part of the theme towards the unknown, that started in Beijing in 2018 and ends in Tokyo with the next world congress in 2021 (postponed a year because of Covid-19).

With the subtheme confronting the present, AAG2019 aimed to present an artistic program with productions from all continents, and a professional program that would reflect the most important challenges our field are facing in our time.



BACKGROUND

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TWO VENUES, TWO PROGRAMS: MAIN VENUE AND NORDIC VENUE

Nearly all program events took place in one of two buildings in the heart of Kristiansand, a five minutes walk from each other. Kilden theatre and concert hall was the main venue. Kilden housed the festival hub, ticket office, main venue shows professional program and ceremonies. The Main Venue program was selected by an artistic council in collaboration with the festival team and the board of Assitej Norway. Link to Kilden: www.kilden.com

The Nordic Venue program was located at a venue called Teateret. The Nordic Venue program was created in collaboration with the Nordic-Baltic Assitej Network and featured one production from each of the countries plus Sápmi and Greenland, ten productions in total, and professional events. 2 young delegates from each of the countries together with three classes of drama students from Agder, 36 in all.


The program combined exclusive workshops and social program with joining general delegates in the professional program.



In 2019, Assitej Norway received a grant of NOK 1 615 000 from the Norwegian Dept of Culture. In our budget, Assitej Norway allocated part of the grant to cover festival costs; NOK 1 265 000. A combination of fewer delegate passes sold and higher expenses than budgeted resulted in a need to allocate a higher sum; NOK 1 798 031. As a result, Assitej Norway lost its equity, and had a small deficit for 2019.

As a direct result of the deficit, Assitej Norway decided to wait until September 2021 to host the next Norwegian Assitej Festival. Despite the negative financial result, Assitej Norway is proud to have hosted the ASSITEJ Artistic Gathering in 2019. We are already seeing results of AAG2019 in our work on a national, Nordic-Baltic and international level.
