How do we make young people become more aware of who they are? It is when participants return to say "thank you for saving me from the world. I realise now that I am enrolled in University. I made a good choice to do drama when I was at school". We submit ourselves to a process and allow ourselves to be transformed; we can then witness social change. Illicit social change is when you come into a process unprepared to be who you are and prepared to change others. Who pointed out there is need for change? Are you working towards changing the effects of the cause or looking into the

I try to be in the shoes of the participant and to develop trust. Young@home made me realise that without trust, we can never get into the innocence of the Child's reflective stories. Children are honest, they want to learn the truth and they are curious about life. When the inner child in me plays, both the old and young play too. We then find ways to not be heroes and eradicate issues, but rather work towards a better future for the participants.

I am proud and inspired by the impact on the lives of young people and old age pensioners through the telling of their personal stories. It has made me realise how important my work is within the Hillbrow community to empower by giving skills to develop their self-esteem, improve their self-confidence and developing voices about the world around them. This has not just been evident with participants from Hillbrow Theatre Project, but also with the older people at Tswelopele Frail Care Centre. It has taught both the old and young that sharing of stories can reflect similarities and differences of our past, present and future.
