Navigating the Cradle Programme



ASSITEJ Azerbaijan Development and Expansion of Creative Relations with Foreign Theaters



ASSITEJ – Azerbaijan National Center – Azerbaijan State Theater of Young Spectators attaches great importance to further development and expansion of creative relations with foreign theaters as in previous months.

Under the terms of the reciprocal visits Chechen State Theater of Young Spectators will make a tour to Baku on May 5-7 of this year with "The Tale of Golden Racer" performance on the stage of Azerbaijan State Theater of Young Spectators and on May 19-21with the "Royal Cow" performance on the stage of Georgia State Professional Theater of Young Spectators.

On May 12-22 of this year, Azerbaijan will host the global scaled "Islamic Solidarity Games". ASSITEJ Azerbaijan is specially preparing for that international event. During those days the theater's repertoire will include Azerbaijan and world classical dramatic examples and the performances will be shown to tourists who will be arriving to the country. The performances will be shown in English with ranlines.

In May, artistic director of Rostov "Maximum" theater, chairman of Rostov Art School will be invited to Baku. She will direct the "Chipolino" by G.Rodari.

In June, the State Theater of Young Spectators will participate in Kazakhstan's annual "Greeting from stage" Theater Festival with the "I Came Girls" ("War") performance by Lars Nuren, Swedish playwright.

In addition, during June 12-18 the theater will make the tour to the 9 Azerbaijan regions with the support and active participation ASSITEJ Azerbaijan. Theater staff will perform "Adventure of Khani Vizier Lankaran" by M.F. Axundzadeh. Theater also is planning to organize the meeting with the pupils and teaching staff for increasing of interest in art in the regions located far from the capital Baku and hold training sessions for younger audience with the final performance show.



ASSITEJ China 7th China Children's Theatre Festival 7 July - 20 August, Beijing, Jinan, Chengdu, China



Approved by Ministry of Culture and jointly hosted by China National Theatre for Children and ASSITEJ China, the 7th China Children's Theatre Festival will be held from July 7th to August 20th, 2017.

On the theme of "Light Children's Heart and Shape the Future", the festival tries to show various kinds of culture and art from different countries, helping Chinese audience to learn more about the world. The 7th China Children's Theatre Festival will last for 45 days, gathering about more than 30 excellent productions from more than 8 countries and districts, such as China, Spain, Lebanon, Holland, Israel, Romania, Russia, Czech etc., with more than 200 shows and more than 15 drama activities , which will benefit more than 160 thousand audiences. Besides Beijing, the festival will also hold branch sessions in three other cities, including Jinan, Chengdu.

China Children's Theatre Festival has been successfully held six sessions since 2011. Through excellent international drama performances and communications, children's drama seminars and various drama activities, China Children's Theatre Festival has become an important window to display domestic and foreign drama achievements; provided a great platform to

promote the developments and communications, as well as a new bridge to gather strength and supports.

To further the festival's worldwide recognition and to invite more audiences and experts to it, there will be some new events launched in the 7th China Children's Theatre Festival. ASSITEJ Cuba By the Way of Water Festival 8-14 May, Havana, Cuba



We are going to celebrate a special festival in Havana. Its name: By the way of water. It's going to take place in a peculiar place, in the municipality of Boyeros, where the first aqueduct in Havana was built in the 18th century.

Boyeros is an outlying zone where more than forty thousand people live and work with scant access to artistic offers.

"Ship of Antilles" is the theater group who created this festival. Its leader, director and master Julio Cordero has long experience in theater and TV productions for children in Cuba and Colombia. For five times they have organized this event, and this festival has grown this time. Fifteen theater groups are going to participate in this edition. Artists and groups from Mexico, Colombia, Venezuela and Argentina are going to join to Cuban artists and groups. Many amateur artist and groups of theater and dance that belong to the municipality are going to participate in this encounter as well.

All of them are going to show their plays in several schools at the municipality, get the children to pay attention to water and its vital role in the world and in life.

The festival program includes conferences by experts in Ecology and Environmental Protection, meeting for artists and teachers and original games for children. On the last day all participants will make a traditional toast with... a glass of water!

The 25th ASSITEJ Korea International Summer Festival will be held from July 19 to 30, 2017. Along with the annual summer festival, the 2nd Korea-Japan-China Performing Art Festival for Children will be hosted by the Korean side from July 29 to July 30. This summer, 14 plays from 11 different countries are scheduled to be presented in Daehak-ro area and Jongno Children's Theatre.

The theme of this year's Summer Festival is: "Curiosity on the Stage!"

The Summer Festival has been focusing on highlighting one country in order to encourage Korean children to understand various cultures through the performances.

This year, the festival focuses on Mexico to celebrate 55 years of diplomatic relations between Korea and Mexico. The Summer Festival is organized with four Mexican performances including Opening performance "Dziu the bird" and other activities inspired by Mexican culture.

On April 29th, Jongno Children's Theatre Celebrated the First Anniversary

Jongno Children's Theatre, the first municipal theatre only for children, marked its first anniversary. To celebrate it, the 2nd Street Festival for Children was held around the theatre on April 29th. Instead of cars, the street was filled with children for street performances, flea markets, and hands-on activities such as drawing on the street. Also included was a Korea-Japan collaborative project street parade directed by Mr. Koga Masakki from Japan, with performances by Japanese team "to R Mansion", Korean teams "Black Crown" and "Croquiky Brothers".



Along with the Children's Street Festival, the production "The Story of a Mother" was first presented at the theatre. It will be continued until May 21st, 2017 for a celebration of the Jongno Children's Theatre's first anniversary. Originally written by Hans Christian Andersen, this production was co-operated by Director Tae-sook Han and Artistic Director Sookhee Kim, featuring the famous senior actress Jeong-ja Park. It is

distinguished from other productions for children as the concept of death is represented.

First Edition of **Tamasha Festival 2017** with its tag line (**Performing Arts For young audience**) organized by new born ASSITEJ Pakistan got marvelous response and was successful to leae its prints in Lahore. ASSITEJ Pakistan, which got registration from ASSITEJ in January 2017 organized this three-day colorful event presenting performances, workshops and discussion sessions by eminent national and international artists on April 7-9.

Tamasha Festival showcased 8 theater, dance and music performances by professional groups, 21 theater performances by schools & 10 performing arts workshops for children and young audience with 8 discussion sessions about performing arts and theatre for children & young audience with well-known performing arts personalities. Estimated 13,280 attendees of which major number of participants were children & young audience.

(Slovenian Theatre Institute) and the Cankarjev Dom Cultural and Congress Centre. The festival was founded in 1993, when its first edition – featuring exclusively theatre performances for children and young people –, was presented to the public. The festival shows the best Slovenian drama, musical, puppet, dance and experimental performances for young viewers, aiming to present the most



successful artistic achievements in the field of performing arts.

One of the festival's long-term goals is to establish a quality exchange between the fields of culture and education. We promote selected performances as recommendable educational contents in the field of performing arts, as well as devote special attention to developing of special accompanying pedagogical materials and preparing of little viewers for watching of their theatrical performances. The festival is thus becoming a platform for pedagogues who select contents for kindergartens and schools. In addition, it also provides the best information about current productions for foreign selectors.

ASSITEJ Sweden Last arrangement in the Shadowland project



On March 20 we celebrated The World Day of Theatre for Children and young people and brought our Shadowland project to an end with seminars, discussions and performances on and in cooperation with Unga Klara in Stockholm.

The project has been unique in its attempt to compare and to encourage collaboration between Swedish and European performing arts institutions concerning an issue of growing importance, racism, in many countries. Through the activities, seminars, workshops, meetings and festivals, we have made an inventory of methodology and practice and gained insight into the level of engagement in Sweden and other countries, and presented the result for colleagues and the general public. All in all we have presented five foreign and three Swedish productions and we have organized nine seminars and panel discussions as well as seven workshops with school students and involved more than 80 artists and pedagogues in the project.

Report with introduction and summary in English will be printed in late May.

During the day the General Assembly of ASSITEJ was held and a new board was elected. Joining cultures: Putting on stage plays based on translations.

I want to share the experience we have had, Hugo Arrevillaga Serrano (director), a group of Mexican actors, actresses and theater creators and me (translator), in the production of plays



for young audiences in Mexico based on texts translated from French into Spanish. We have done Pacamambo (2007-2009) by Wajdi Mouawad (Ouebec) and Désordre Public (Desorden Público, 2009-2010) by Evelyne de la Chenelière (Quebec) with our former company Tapioca Inn. And Assoiffés (Sedientos, 2011-2012) by Wajdi Mouawad (Quebec), S'embrasent (Abrasados, 2013-2015) by Luc Tartar (France) and Léon le nul (León el bueno para nada, 2016-2017) by Francis Monty (Quebec) as a new group in the last six years. These plays, in some cases, coproduced by Mexican public theater institutions and programs (Teatro Escolar / Instituto Nacional de Bellas Artes -INBA- and Teatro La Capilla / Fondo Nacional para la Cultura y las Artes -FONCA) have been presented during various seasons in different theaters in Mexico City and in festivals in Mexico. The longevity of these plays and its "happy marriages" with its audiences (children and adolescents from 8

years up), have been, in my opinion, due to three main reasons: 1) authors with a personal poetic, that build stories that leave out any moral judgement on their characters and actions and deal with topics that have been forbidden or rarely presented in the theater for young audiences in Mexico like sex and sexuality (S'embrasent), death (Pacamambo), suicide and the search for beauty (Assoiffés) and the demystification of the family as a "heaven" of peace and love (Léon le nul), 2) a good adaptation of these stories by the director and the performers, not by simplifying the story but by finding its proper rhythm, humour and tone in the translated language, 3) and programmers (like Boris Schoemann, theater translator and artistic director of La Capilla Theater, Monica Juárez, that used to be, for many years, responsible of Teatro Escolar –INBA- and Marisa Giménez Cacho who used to be in charge of Teatro para Niños y Jóvenes –INBA-) that are not afraid of taking risks with "foreign" texts and have faith that they can say something to their audiences in Mexico. This has been the key for us, not only to search and translate "foreign" texts, but also to produce and present them to the Mexican audiences: strong texts, sensible creators and intelligent and brave people directing public institutions.

Unluckily, this hasn't been the case in the last three or four years in Mexico. The cutbacks in culture and specifically in theater have been enormous. And nowadays the creation in general, and for young audiences in specific, is in danger. The number of plays for young audiences produced or coproduced by public institutions have decreased dramatically. So at the end of day we, creators, have to produce our plays with our money. And then "if" programed in the public theaters receive as payment a percentage (that goes from the 60% to the 70%) of the box office. That is ridiculous since the price of a ticket for a spectacle of this kind goes from \$2 to \$5 American Dollars and the publicity coordinated by the institutions is not enough. So it is impossible to pay a decent salary to the team of 6 or 7 creators that participated in the creation of the spectacle.

The future of the creation for young audiences seems grim in Mexico. We really need a revalorization of our work starting with the help and guidance of the people in charge of the public institutions, who must convince the state and federal government to give enough economic resources to start, again, producing shows that will allow companies to keep doing their jobs and continue participating in the development of our theater for young audiences.
