

African Artists empowered to be at Cradle of Creativity

Through attracting relevant sponsorships and partnerships, ASSITEJ SA was able to invite and support the attendance of 189 South African artists and 42 artists from other countries on the African continent.

These included:

- 25 Northern Cape Artists
- 12 Free State Artists
- 4 Western Cape Artists
- 6 Limpopo Artists
- 20 Next Generation SA and African Artists
- 10 RMB-Sponsored Artists
- 60 AfterSchool Game-Changer artists / facilitators
- 20 artists supported to present at the Producer's Bazaar / Early Years
- 36 conference presenters

The following African countries were represented in some aspect of Cradle of Creativity: Angola, Benin, Botswana, Burkina Faso, Cameroon, DRC, Ghana, Guinea, Kenya, Lesotho, Madagascar, Malawi, Mozambique, Namibia, Nigeria, Rwanda, Tanzania, Togo, Uganda, Zambia and Zimbabwe.

Their participation was made possible with thanks to Pro Helvetia, Goethe Institut, RMB, Wesgro, the National Research Foundation, the provincial governmental departments of Limpopo, Northern Cape, Western Cape and Free State, ASSITEJ, IFAS and Scenes d'Enfance.

This is apart from the many South Africans and Africans who attended the event of their own accord, and the 126 people who volunteered or interned on the festival, which also gave them access to free performances in exchange for their energy.

As a result of these collective efforts, this is by far the largest African representation ever seen at an ASSITEJ event, and has energised African artists about the work of the association and the importance of theatre for children and young people. We hope to see a number of collaborative and exchange projects, as well as a continued presence of African artists in international ASSITEJ programmes, as a legacy of this important event.
