During the same break a lot of amateur youngsters turn professional each year as the season provides them opportunities of conducting workshops or performing their plays with some of the professional TYA companies. And a lot of collaborations and coming-together initiatives also take place. This year immediately after the vacations end ASSITEJ India is going to provide them another opportunity of regional co-operation and international collaborations.

Come July and "The Little Festival" in Chennai, together with ASSITEJ India, the ASSITEJ Asia meeting will be organized. The biannual ASSITEJ Asia meeting has been happening for several years. ASSITEJ in itself has been the success story of collaborations, co-operations, networking and of coming together. The same idea has given birth to these regional networks which focus on the needs of regions more closely. In a continent like Asia, which is huge in size and which in itself has multiple regions such as Middle East, South Asia, East Asia, South East Asia, etc., there are innumerous numbers of styles, concepts, and projects. Opportunities are in the air. This year for the first time, the ASSITEJ Asia meeting has extended its circle to Australia as well, which is actually part of Oceania, is very much into Asia and this was felt in different aspects; geographically they are so close to us and the huge Asian population at the island/country/continent also brings them much closer to Asia than any other region.

So from the 4th to the 7th of July a group of TYA artists, administrators, and thinkers will be meeting at The Little Festival, to discuss the situation, needs, possibilities and opportunities in the continent known as ASIA. It's an open invitation to counterparts from the rest of the world to come and join us. We may be talking within the boarder lines of Asia but it's going to be about art which has no boundaries and no limits.

ASSITEJ supports Next Generation Placements to provide younger theatre artists, producers and administrators with individual opportunities for international mobility within the field of Theatre for Young Audiences (TYA) and in order to encourage contact and exchange between experienced and emerging artists.

Young people with an interest for and/or experience in TYA will have the opportunity to share experiences, learn and work with artists in other countries within the framework of different projects such as festivals, seminars, workshops, forums, productions, etc.

Any person related to TYA between 18 and 35 years old may apply for a placement through this program, and may apply to ASSITEJ for limited financial support.

The ASSITEJ Next Generation Placements Program is a continuous program, with offers from all around the world. Offers are accepted throughout the whole year and each offer will have its own deadlines.

ASSITEJ has the duty to promote the Next Generation Placements by looking for and encouraging new offers, distributing this information among members, publishing the offers on its website and being the contact between offer-makers and applicants when needed. "3 Times About to be a Child and to Become an Adult"

An international project from Diana Rojas (Zurich), Melika Ramic (Wien) und Tammy Reichling (Luxemburg) in Coproduction with the Stadelhofen Theater in Zürich, the international theater festival Schäxpir in Linz und Neimenster in Luxemburg.

Three emerging artists from three different countries are creating three duets with an adult and child, about the topic: to be a child and to become an adult. These three 20-minute duets will be presented together and will show three different time perspectives (past, present and future) about the same topic.

"Why can't I stop the time? What would the child I was, say about the life I'm having right now? What happened with the dreams I had? How does the child see its own future? With these kinds of questions, the three artists are creating their duets".

This collaboration involves three artists, who met at the Theaterfestival SCHÄXPIR in June 2013 in Linz as part of the ASSITEJ Next Generation residency: "The Next Generations residency gave us the opportunity to see performances together, discuss and share practice, and to thereby discover a common interest in intergenerational performance work. At this stage in our career, it's a brilliant and exceptionally beneficial opportunity to collaborate. We are very excited at the prospect of working together across countries, and developing adult-child duets in connection with each other. This is an invaluable opportunity for our development as artists working across disciplines and countries".

International meeting was held in the ASSITEJ - Azerbaijan National Center, which is always in the center of attention with interesting projects and meetings.

Creative staff attended on the Colombo International Mono-plays Theatre Festival in Sri - Lanka from March 26 - till April 4, 2013.

June will be memorable with one more International event for Azerbaijan State Theatre of Young Spectators – ASSITEJ Azerbaijan National Center. Two young and talented theatre actors will participate in the IX International Theatre Summer School implemented by Theatre Figures Union of Russian Federation and Ministry of Culture of RF.

More than 81 participants from USA, Australia, Great Britain, Germany, Azerbaijan, Ukraine, Poland, Georgia and overall from 20 countries will attend the summer school in Zvenygorod, the region of Moscow during 1-28th of June.

There will be daily training program as well as master-classes with well-known theatre figures.

The main purpose of large-scale training project – International Theatre Summer School for young actors is for sharing experience with different countries representatives, develop a new school of acting, and increase the level of professionalism.

International Theatre Summer School is organized by Theatre Figures Union of Russian Federation and Ministry of Culture of RF. This summer school, which is started in 2007, has

already trained more than 800 artists from more than 40 countries.

ASSITEJ Korea The 23rd ASSITEI Korea International Summer Festival

July 21 to August 2, 2015

Since the summer of 1993, ASSITEJ Korea has organized one of the most prestigious theatre festivals for children and young people in Korea. The Summer Festival is mainly supported by the Korean Ministry of Culture, Sports, and Tourism every year, and is one of the highly recognized festivals to receive such funding from the Ministry regularly.

This year, 13 pieces from 9 different countries full of poetic beauty in various types of theatre arts will be presented in all at Daehakro Arts Theatre and ARKO Arts Theatre in Daehangno. the theatre district, for about 20,000 audiences from July 21 to August 2. Also, 3 outstanding Korean pieces including an award-winning piece in Seoul Children's Theatre Awards 2015 will be presented.

Spanish Focus

Since 2010, the Summer Festival has highlighted one particular country in order to encourage Korean children to experience various cultures through theatre arts. In 2015. Spain is the guest of honor to celebrate 65 years of diplomatic ties between Korea and Spain. Presenting impressive lineup of 3 Spanish theatre productions and 1 Korean production inspired by a Spanish author, the Summer Festival also provides other noticeable activities for audiences and artists.

Korea - Denmark Andersen Project-The Nightingale presented at Aprilfestival in Frederikssund, Denmark

"Andersen Project-The Nightingale," premiered in ASSITEJ Korea International Summer Festival 2014 commemorating the 55th year of diplomatic ties between Korea and Denmark, was presented at Festival of Frederikssund Gymnasium in Denmark on April 21 and 22, 2015.

One of the international guest performances of the Aprilfestival, was produced by an ASSITEJ Korea member company, Jayu-Madang, with a Danish director, Torkild Lindebjerg, and a Danish costume designer, Camilla Lind.

Though performed in Korean with little English words, the piece was enjoyed by international audiences including local Danish residents through universal message by H.C. Andersen, beautiful songs, simple but striking visual elements, etc., and some Danish audiences gave a standing ovation.

The idea of the collaboration was to interact and share experiences from two cultures in the creation of a well-known fairy-tale in an intimate and poetic atmosphere. The reason for bringing the piece to the Danish festival was to present this first result of a fruitful collaboration between the two countries and to expand the possibilities of interaction between Korean and Danish artists, said Mr. Peter Manscher, the coordinator of the Festival.

This tour was made possible by the grant of "Center Stage Korea Focus 2015" supported by Korea Arts Management Services.

Introduction of TYA in Japan by Asaya Fujita

1.- There were no performing arts for children in Japan'

Japan is considered as a country of traditional theatre. Certainly, Noh and Kyogen have 600 years of history and Kabuki has 400 years of history. But there were no performing arts for children in these art forms. There were children as characters in the plays but they were usually those getting killed as a substitute for a master's



child, and those sacrificed to the slave trade, and nobody had imagined children being part of the audiences. There was such a thing called "Children's Kabuki" but it was simply an imitation of Kabuki played by adults and was not suitable for children to watch. In short, it was not thought that children would need ...

Halina Machulska and her ASSITEJ

Halina Machulska is an actress, teacher, educator, theatre director, co-founder of an acting school—a legendary figure both of Polish theatre with its sense of mission, and of the amateur theatre movement. A personality endowed with a charisma of a successful leader. The wife of Jan Machulski and the mother of Juliusz Machulski, she has always been a shining star on her own, and not reflecting somebody else's brilliance. She is an unusual phenomenon, made up, I daresay, of female authority, motherly tenderness, magical womanly charm and puckish appeal of a born comedian.
