Introduction by Daniel Fernández

Seeds that sprout

A new International Festival for Young Audiences is born in the region. This fact, which could be read as an isolated incident, or like a lost letter in an incomplete alphabet, is itself the result of the exchange and the encounter between the makers of Theatre for Young Audiences (TYA) led by ASSITEJ in its effort to promote it.

Independent Theatre is a particular movement in Argentina. Its epicenter is in the city of Buenos Aires. The movement was born in the '40s and it has the particularity that its work is done without the government's economic support, and it offers an autonomous artistic work, a theatrical proposal far from the commercial theatre circuit. This movement provides theatres with an infrequent quantity of different poetics.

TYA emerges from the Independent Theatre movement as a specialization. It starts as a creator, and becomes a renovator of the creative imagination of TYA, thanks to the work of directors such as Hugo Midón, Carlos de Urquiza, Héctor Presa, Manuel González Gil, Andrés Bazalo and many others, that since the '80s have been proposing a different way of understanding TYA.

ATINA (Asociación de Teatristas Independientes para Niños y Adolescentes) was created as an initiative of people within this group, and then the association became a member of ASSITEJ. Since its foundation, ATINA's work has been the creation of networks; first, amongst the founders of TYA, and between the emerging experiences; afterwards in a regional level; and last, but not least, in an international level. ATINA has always looked for the exchange with other regions, with other aesthetics, other systems of production, giving and receiving art, to make our TYA grow.

Within this framework, The XXI Encounter of Theatre, Puppets and Stories is born, organized by the UPeBe (*Universidad Popular de Belgrano*), and sponsored by ATINA. This 1st International Festival will take place in Buenos Aires, Argentina, from July 18th to 22nd, with the presence of casts from Italy, Chile, Uruguay and Mexico.

This new festival has the imprint of the region and was born from the depths of Argentinean independent theatre, and it has the strength and charm of a seed that sprouts.


FRIENDS OF ASSITEJ


FESTECA - International Theatre Festival of Cazenga

"The Last Leaf" theater, directed by Mohammad Boroumand, sets out to India to participate in The Little Festival, Chennai,

India:

The sixth edition of Chennai International Festival promotes peace, understanding and empathy through dramatic arts this year. Simorgh theater group will have three performances in this festival.

"The Last Leaf" by Simorgh International Group is a combination of theater and media and is non-verbal. With a fantasy and fiction structure, it deals with the consequences of the quarrels, domestic fights and international wars.

The audiences will accompany us in performing this play and they will try to reach "peace and friendship for all".

"The Last Leaf" theater was produced in 2014 with actors from Iran, USA, Afghanistan and Canada and was staged in Tehran and war areas; then it was performed in Sarajevo International Peace Festival in Bosnia and Herzegovina and was welcomed by this country's people and media.

Iranian traditional theater workshop in India:

Mohammad Boroumand also added that Chennai International Festival has arranged two workshops for him to introduce Iranian dramatic arts to the artists of different countries at this festival, and familiarize them with Iranian puppet theater techniques. He will also teach construction of the marionettes in another workshop for children.



Iranian Children as World Peace Propagators:

Mohammad Boroumand as the designer, writer and director of "The Last Leaf" has used 8 year-old children this year to perform this show in the international festivals; those fluent in Persian, English and French will perform this show for the other children.

International Summer Festival Evaluated as "Very Excellent"

The 22nd ASSITEJ Korea International Summer Festival was evaluated as "very excellent" grade by the Arts Council Korea.

The evaluation was made for all programs of arts and culture financially supported by the Arts Council Korea last year. The 22nd ASSITEJ Korea International Summer Festival

in 2014 was rated top as the one and only performing arts festival, and chosen as 1 of the 3 most excellent arts and cultural activities in Korea.

The evaluation was made in the categories of 5 areas, and the Festival was highly ranked, over 90%, especially in artistic contribution, programming, and management of festival organization.

9 Korean and 1 international quality theatre pieces for children will be presented in 14 local towns

"Art Dream Theatre Festival for Local Young Audiences 2015" marks its 6th edition after more than 40 times in 14 local towns, the biggest in terms of geographical scale since its establishment.



Unlike 2 other festivals organized by ASSITEJ Korea, this Festival does not take place in Seoul, but in local cities and small towns where cultural activities are rare and children are culturally isolated. Moreover, for the first time, an international piece will be presented to local young audiences and their parents, and "Overture" by Teatergruppen Batida from Denmark was chosen to be presented at 3 venues.

14 towns, 9 across the Korean Peninsula, are new to the program of the Festival. Supported by Hyundai Motor Group, a world-renowned motor company in Korea, the Festival will begin on October 5 and continue till October 28, 2015.

Over the past 5 years, approximately 12,000 local audiences have benefitted by this arts and culture program.

Puro Teatro is an annual Children's Theatre Festival which takes place every summer in Mexico, from July 20-26 presenting the most representative professional theatre companies throughout theatres in the country.

This festival has been happening for 17 years now, is completely free for the general public and offers children's theatre workshops. Organized by the theatre company La Trouppe, the Mexican Social Security Institute(IMSS), and the National Arts and Culture Council (CONACULTA), through their program "Alas y Raíces a los Niños".



Looking Back on Next Generation in Linz 2013

In June, 2013 I had the opportunity to attend the Next Generation Program of ASSITEJ in Linz, Austria as the only representative of Mexico; I was fortunate to meet with creators for young audiences from all over the world; I returned full of dreams to accomplish, one of them to work for early childhood; I also returned willing to replicate the dialogue and to build the necessary networks in order to bring the best possible theatre for young audiences; with the impulse of my experience in Austria, two years later in June of 2015 I premiere the show "Where is Isabela?" for children from 0 to 3 years, the



second or third show for babies in the country and the first in the western region; the children's response to the experience has been beautiful, strong and enriching; families were enchanted by this integrating project of an early childhood that has been long forgotten in this country of ours.

Additionally, I celebrate that this year one of the members of the "Where is Isabela?" team is now at the Next Generation meeting organized in the same city of Linz; accompanying all the activities from the Schaxpir Festival, building new dreams and dialogues; I'm sure that Oz Jiménez will also return with vital impulses that will lead us to build a more solid theatre for babies, children and young people, and based on our community, on our country.


ASSITEJ South Africa

AFRICAN YOUTH THEATRE AND DANCE FESTIVAL:

At this inaugural festival, ASSITEJ SA brought together youth and emerging artists from 9 African countries including Botswana, Cameroon, Lesotho, Mozambique, Nigeria, Swaziland, Zambia, Zimbabwe and of course South Africa. The group of around 75 young people aged 15-21 spent a week in workshops, play reading

rehearsals and watching performances, while the 15 writers and 15 directors had their own series of workshops and engagements as they worked to bring new pieces of theatre for young audiences to life. The next phase of this engagement will be the further development of 5 of the playwrights through the New Visions New Voices Festival at the Kennedy Centre in Washington, the possible production of several of the plays by Soweto theatre, and the possible selection of some of the emerging works for the 2017 World Congress. The festival was sponsored by the Department of Arts and Culture's Mzansi Golden Economy programme and several of the professional pieces were staged with the support of the National Arts Council of South Africa.



New Generations in Chlidren's Theatre in Spain

With the start of the new century ASSITEJ-Spain underwent a marked change. The arrival of young professionals into children's theatre bringing with them innovative ideas and committed to the problems of the society in which they live, along with the development of our young audience, meant an obvious step forward in terms of quality and strictness for theatrical arts geared towards infants and young people.



Interaction between writers, performers and directors has its roots in the decade of the seventies with young people taking to the stage, thus allowing for the handling of topics forbidden during the dictatorial period of censorship with its imposition of rigid criteria. In a series of theatrical encounters held in the city of Granada, professionals working there reached the conclusion that there were no taboo topics for theatre aimed towards the youngest audience, rather that the development of conflicts was not properly handled, along with the lack of new contemporary methods in the majority of the productions.
