Introduction

Why Placements?

Why do we keep reminding the TYA community to think about Placements program? Why do we urge ASSITEJ members to find ways to open up new opportunities for young artists and theatre makers, to look for fresh flow, to participate in this great and exciting global exchange?

NG Placements is in many ways a very specific programme: it is a platform that offers a variety of possibilities in individual residencies for young and emerging artists. Each and every NG Placements offer is created as a unique opportunity, different from the previous ones; as an artistic and experiential challenge for both the host and the participant, in which their biggest investment is their personal commitment. It is particularly this multiplicity of specific opportunities that makes the results of the programme almost unpredictable. Nevertheless, previous participants' feedback reveals splendid experiences almost without exception, reassuring us that encountering colleagues and individuals willing to share and commit to one common purpose - a good theatre for all children, is something that is of special value regardless of generational, geographical or artistic background.

In NG Placement program, ASSITEI has the role of a mediator who is inviting and encouraging its large membership to create and open these unique opportunities intended for young artists, administrators or producers. Moreover, ASSITEJ aims to make these opportunities more visible and accessible to as many interested seekers as possible, as well as to learn from the experiences of previous participants in order to enhance the program for future generations. The questions popping up after the realization of all the placements are of special interest to us: were both the host and the participant satisfied? Were there any new ideas created amid a flow of freshly shared energy? Was the match successful from the perspective of mutual, artistic understanding and recognition? Did the presence of a new, young face refresh the memories of experienced theatre makers on their beginnings, reminding them of the defining moment in their careers and strengthening their commitment to the theatre for children and young people? And did the newly established collaboration bring them to rediscover their long- fostered work and professional knowledge and pass it on to an emerging artist eager to learn? That is why we are asking all of the hosts as well as selected participants to write a report after their placement ends and share their impressions and experiences. Let us see what some of them have told us! "I can say that PLACEMENTS is a project that can help to increase the exchange between cultures and forms of arts, and as well, to open the international perspective to create new ways of artistic work", said Elena Manzo from Mexico. Elena has spent one week of February 2015 at Theatre an der Parkaue in Berlin. "The week I worked with the Winterakademie was very interesting, intense and full of creativity. I could develop my capacities as an artist and learn from the theatre team and from the work with the kids. The chance to get to know new people in theatre and to work with children and teenagers in Berlin, expanded the point of view in my work as an artist, and helped me to develop new ways of working."

Call for proposals: ARTISTS MEET EARLY YEARS

Opportunity

Next year it will be 30 years since La Baracca and

the Municipality of Bologna began the project Teatro e Nido (Theatre and crèche), that gave the starting impulse to the research the company has been developing on theatre for early years.

On this occasion, La Baracca, together with the Municipality of Bologna, wants to offer to a group of **young artists** (under 35) the opportunity to enter the educational facilities for children 0-3 and 3-6 years old. The artists will have the chance to "**meet the children**" presenting them a brief performance, telling a story, leading a small workshop, talking with and observing them. They will have the chance to visit one or two services during the festival.

Visioni is a theatre festival for early years and it is one of the Small size Festivals. Small size – the European Network for the Diffusion of Performing Arts for Early Years – has existed since 2005 with the support of the European Commission through the Culture Programme.

The Festival is the core of an international network which includes exchange among artists, educators, teachers, pedagogues and professionals working with the target group of early year children. During the festival it is possible to attend many different events, such as shows, training activities, meetings, lectures, conferences and seminars.

"Visioni di futuro, Visioni di teatro..." will take place at Testoni Ragazzi Theatre in Bologna (Italy) from February 27th to March 6th 2016.

This call is open to 6 artists, to whom we will offer accommodation and subsistence for 3 days.

We would like to tell you about a work-inprogress showing of 'This, That': our new work

of contemporary theatre for children aged 2-5, that is showing as part of the ASSITEJ Korea Summer festival, from July 31 to August 2.

A new collaboration between artists from Australia and Korea, 'This, That' work-in-progress performance is the outcome of 4 weeks of creative development, with 2 weeks taking place in Brisbane in February, and 2 weeks in Seoul in July 2015. These showings are a chance to test our ideas for this new work with audiences here in Seoul before we move into production for an Australian and Korean premiere planned for 2016.

Inspired by children's remarkable capacity to intuitively explore, investigate and generally accept the differences of others, 'This, That' is a playful exploration of the extraordinary insights that can be gained by experiencing and embracing that which is different. This project continues Imaginary Theatre's investigation into devised early-years theatre, and builds on our 10 year relationship with Korean artists.

Lutkovno gledališče Ljubljana (Ljubljana Puppet Theatre), Slovenski gledališki inštitut (Slovenian Theatre Institute) and Cankarjev Dom Cultural and Congress Centre. The festival was founded in 1993, when its first edition - featuring exclusively theatre performances for children and young people -, was presented to the public. Starting with this year the festival will bring a selection of best Slovenian drama, musical, puppet, dance and experimental performances for children and young people aiming to present most successful artistic achievements in the field of performing arts. The 16th festival, which is to take place from 5th to 10th October 2015 in Slovenia's capital Ljubljana, will lay its special focus on cultural education, thus pursuing its goal of establishing standards of quality within the field $\frac{1}{2}$ of theatre for children and young people and encouraging a quality, diverse and continuous production of performing arts for children and young people. Organizing this year's edition of the festival Lutkovno gledališče Ljubljana will be joined by the Slovenian Theatre Institute dedicating itself as a National Institution to exploring and understanding of theatre culture and the central Slovenian cultural and congress venue Cankarjev dom. On this occasion, we are sharing contributions on the history of ASSITEJ Russia and ASSITEJ Sweden.

Master's Legacy. Disciples' Experience. ASSITEJ Russia.

Russian theater director and actor Yury Petrovich Kiselev, laureate of the various Russian and international awards, was one of those who actively participated in bringing ASSITEJ ideas and concepts to life 50 years ago. During his career in theater Yury Kiselev occupied one of the leading



positions in the Russian office and international system of ASSITEJ and generously shared his rich experience helping to organize youth theaters in Cuba, USA, France, Yugoslavia, German Democratic Republic, Spain, and Czechoslovakia. In Russia he is mostly remembered as an artistic director of the world's oldest professional theater for children that opened on the 4th of October in 1918 in Saratov, Russia. He led the theater from 1943 until his death in 1996, and today it is known as the Saratov Academic Youth Theater named after Yu.P. Kiselev.

In 1974, the Swedish Government decided



on a new cultural policy. Its basic idea was that art, in all various expressions, should be available for all citizens, regardless of age or where they lived.

One of the most important and profound ambitions of this new culture-policy, was that every child or youth between the age of 7-16 should have the opportunity to see a professional theatre-performance at least once a year; a non-commercial theatre

performance.

When we started BACKA THEATRE (part of Gothenburg City Theatre) in 1978, this was our fundament. The new policy provided us with the economical possibilities. We were able to gather a group of highly professional, dedicated actors, technicians and several musicians to make our vision come true. We wanted to change the world. We put focus on our young audience. Our aim was to give them unexpected, artistic and musical experiences. We did both newly written and classical texts. We wanted them to feel "you are not alone."

The word solidarity was, and still is, the credo of Backa Theatre, now with Mattias Andersson as artistic director.
