The best production awards are divided into categories of age -


toddlers to age 8 and from age 9 to 18, as well as a special category for multi-disciplinary theatre. The committee divides them into these categories for the judges to choose.

The judges assign a number between 1-5 and the one with the highest points will win in each respective category.

The judicial process is orderly and well organized by the committee and a production team, resulting in a three-week celebration of the highest quality theatre for children and youth attended by enthusiastic children and their parents.

We are very proud of these awards and encourage other countries to award prizes for excellence in theatre for children and youth which could be given official national recognition.

The prizes awarded to the artists are cash prizes with trophies, whereas to the theatres the awards are trophies and the respect that comes with them. For many years the theatre artists of our country preferred to create theatre for adults but in the recent years we witness many artists who have chosen to dedicate their artistic pursuits for children. The awards are a source of pride for us all.

### A successful Frankfurt Playwrights' Forum for TYA

The Frankfurt Playwrights Forum for TYA is a highlight in the year program of Children's and Young People's Theatre Centre and ASSITEJ Germany? Since 1989 this event is of great importance not only to playwrights but also to all those who are interested in the field of dramatic literature, like dramaturges, agents and directors. Up to 130 theatre experts from Germany and abroad are visiting the Forum every year in the first days of December.

This years edition of the Forum, which took place from December 4th to 6th, was a special one. The Children's and Young People's Theatre Centre and ASSITJ Germany celebrated the 25th anniversary of their unique institution. The Centre started its work with the 1st Playwrights' Forum in December 1989, 3 weeks after the fall of the Berlin Wall. This was the starting point for a successful German-German development in TYA. Now, 25 years later, Gerd Taube, director of the Centre, and Wolfgang Schneider, chair of ASSITEJ Germany, published a book about the role of the Centre in the history of this movement. It is titled Kinder und Jugendtheaterzentrum in der Bundesrepublik Deutschland - Forum for Meetings, Platform for Discussions and Place for Discourses.

Beside this celebrations the 26th Forum gave opportunity for the presentation of new and awarded plays and of a prestigious European Playwrights project. In "Theatre Café", established in 2004 by Company of Angels in London, new scripts from Europe are being discussed and presented. Now, ten years later, Adam Barnard from London, Eirik Fauske from Oslo and Roel Adam from Amsterdam where talking on the Forum about their new scripts. The readings of the plays were held by actors from Grips Theatre, Berlin. The participation of "Theatre Café" in the Frankfurt Playwright's Forum demonstrates the importance of an European repertoire in TYA in Germany. Regarding this international context, it made sense to end the Playwright's Forum with a discussion about inter cultural exchange and translation of scripts. This discussion must be continued, e.g. at the ASSITEJ Aristic Gathering in April 2015 in Berlin. Next Playwright's Forum will be held from November 5th to 7th, 2015. Save the date!

PLATFORM SHIFT+ and SMALL SIZE, PERFORMING ARTS FOR THE EARLY YEARS - for the next 4 years, through Creative Europe, the new European Commission's framework programme for support to the culture and audiovisual sectors.

### **Small Size - Performing Arts for the Early Years**

The purpose of the project is to spread the exchange of ideas on performing arts for early years (0-6 years of age) in Europe, through a networking activity able to create new knowledge and awareness in Europe and abroad.

In the upcoming 5-yearlong cooperation we are going to participate together with 15 European partner theatres.

### Platform shift+

Platform shift+ is an international network, created to meet the new challenges of producing theatre for young people in the digital age. Platform shift+ consists of 11 partners from 9 countries: ten long-established theatres with a special focus on young audiences and the Norwegian University of Agder, as an expert in cultural education and monitoring. Together we have identified the urgent need to engage fully with digital technology in order to understand the reality of our target audience.

The project will create a platform to shift theatre for young Europeans today and secure theatre's role in the Europe of tomorrow.

### **ASSITEJ Italia: Educational Meetings 2015**

The ASSITEJ Italia General Meeting - held in Bologna on October  $2^{nd}$ , 2014 at Teatro Testoni Ragazzi - highlighted the strong need to network different professional competences, knowledge and resources about themes and projects in Theatre for Young Audiences. For this, an explicit request emerged for educational meetings to be organized for ASSITEJ members.

Therefore, ASSITEJ received interesting proposals and indications: national organizations are willing to make available places, periods and ideas. With this, it is now possible to schedule a first meeting itinerary between March and June 2015. This first attempt represents an important experiment that we can call:

## INTERNATIONAL PROJECT MAKING Ideas, places, people and actions

The meeting's plan focuses on a specific, vast and complex theme: international projects; that's to say the meeting and the mutual comparison of different people and cultures in order to create events and educational opportunities in Theatre for Young Audiences. In fact, we are deeply convinced that mutual exchange of different experiences and points of view represents a source of cultural - and sometimes even

economica l- richness.

These meetings will allow - with different timing and methods - to face the idea of "making projects" in Europe and in the world : what does it mean to start, promote, coordinate and take part in an international project?

The presence of foreign professionals in National Festivals will offer an important contribution to a confrontation on the themes proposed during the meetings. There will be seminars, workshops and debates that will give anyone the possibility to "take home" a small but important baggage of knowledge. Knowledge meant to be useful to everyone's professional needs and experiences. Moreover, such an exchange will help the confrontation - nowadays unfortunately quite absent - inside the world of Italian Theatre for Young Audiences.





### The 11th ASSITEJ Korea Winter Festival




## Showcase and Workshop of The 11th ASSITEJ Korea Winter Festival, Seoul 2015 January 8 to 17, 2015

### ASSITEJ SERBIA

#### **Autumn highlights**

"Ecology of the soul", art in closed institutions, boarders treated in different ways, all these are themes that were thought and dealt with this Autumn in part of the artistic community in theatre, especially theatre that deals with young people.

It is interesting in what ways theatre makers in Serbia, in spite of complicated social and economic conditions, succeed in establishing new practices. Even though with the abundant problems and needs the processes of artists, slowed down by the lack of systematic support, still manage to change the perceptive of about the significance, meaning and different ways of participation of performing art in the realm of culture, education, care and work with children and youth is evidently visible and slowly but constantly the number of ones that are involved and apply in their work principles of theatre art.

From 4 Festivals, that have by now been supported by ASSITEJ Serbia, this year only two have been realized: International TIBA Festival and the regional Theatre Zvezdarište have not. Becuase of a very difficult financial situation and the lack of the amount of state grants that are enough to cover main costs and fees of the emloyees in theatres founded by the state, the main childrens theatres had to give up a jumber of premiers on yearly level, so every premier is considered a heroic deed.

Theatres out of institutions and theatre groups are faced with new laws that find it hard to access schools, and schools have new measures that find any form of organized travel to organized artistic programs hard. In a society in which a new frame of creating culture is still not formed, it is hard to accomplish a continuity and realization of bigger steps involving years ahead.

Still in our area there was always a number of extraordinary

and progressive artists and individuals and valuable artistic achievements created with quality that went beyond the expected ways and institutional theatre scene.

What is especially valuable is the consciousness and persistence of certain artists that address the young audience considering it is a vulnerable population, and in theartistic engagement that has not been respected enough in many parts of society, so it asks for more effort and requires support of every kind. So in this case we want to stress three events that have been realized by three members of ASSITEJ Serbia: Sanja Krsmanović Tasić (Mater Terra Festival), Aleksandra Jelić (Parol) and Boris Čakširan (Off Frame).

The pilot Festival Mater Terra that has been concieved and realized by Sanja Krsmanović Tasić has gathered drama groups that work in schools and use drama techniques, instantly gathered a lot of interest. "Ecology of the soul" is a new expression, concieved fo the Festival Mater terra, and that for its team means healthy and developed human relationships, openess and acceptance of the other or different, development of empatht and activation of solidarity and support. The festival is not competative, but is concieved as a place for support and exchange between drama groups and studios, a pleace where expert advice can be given and experiences excannged with different groups and schools. The festival was realized in co/production of DAH Theatre Research centra and CEDEUM/ Centre for drama/theatre in education and art, and the team of experts invited to give advice and support consisted of three members: Ljubica Beljanski Ristić, Diana Kržanić Tepavac and Boris Čakširan.

"Every impossibility gives rise to a new opportunity," says Aleksandra Jelic, Executive Director at ApsArt & ApsArt Community Theatre speaking at the Conference Do I Have a Right to Know opening ceremony.

What is the relationship between the personal and creative freedom? Does the loss of freedom of movement means the loss of right to create? Why the artists are so often peered behind the walls and those behind the walls so often resorted to art as a means of release? These questions and attempt to answer to some of them dealt project PAROL which was conducted in five European countries and has been completed in Belgrade in November as conference organized by the ApsArt organization. The organization promotes and educates about the possibilities of theater in the work with vulnerable, disadvantaged and marginalized, groups of children and young people. Its creator, theter director and tireless activist Aleksandra Jelic brought together representatives of various sectors, artists and representatives of organizations for human rights to cross experiences, to shed light on the obstacles / problems together and tried to find some suggestions for solutions which will provide access to the arts and the introduction of artistic disciplines and creative process in working with vulnerable groups, in institutions such as shelters, institutions, psychiatric hospitals, day care centers,... It was a unique opportunity to exchange views in an area that is in our country not yet sufficiently developed, recognized and supported.

Let us mention also OFF FRAME FRAME FESTIVAL 2014 a Belgrade based, regional festival of socially engaged theater, which was held beginig December for the fourth time. The festival gathers authors and organizations from the domain of socially engaged theater in Serbia, the region and beyond, promoting involvement in theatrical work and giving stage time to those who are disempowered in some particular social context. Boris Čakširan whom ASSITEJ Comunity recognizes by its engagement in inclusive arts and active participation in a forming of IIAN network, as artistic director of the Festival chose for its beginning a play for children "The Boy Who Says Yes - The Boy Who Says No" inspired by the classical Japanese drama "Taniko" (Ritual throwing into the valley), as well as Brecht's plays, "He Who Says Yes / He Who Says No" and "The

Horatians and the Curiatians" adapted by Milan Marković and directed by Anđelka Nikolić, production of Little Theatre Duško Radović. The play poses the questions if it is courage to sacrifice oneself for a higher cause? Or is true courage to oppose ancient laws and the opinion of the majority? It is a story about how there is never only one solution, never only one ending. That is thought with which we conclude this article about some events on the theater scene for children and young people in Serbia these days, events and actions that we hope will one day instead of outside flow affect the change for the better.
