A Report from Asia By Asaya Fujita

These days, ASSITEJ in Asia is very active.

The Annual Asian Meeting, which was held in India last year, will be held in Sri Lanka in West Asia this year from August 18th to 20th.

Last summer when we, the presidents from China, Korea, and Japan, had an opportunity to meet, we had decided to have an annual festival rotating among us on a regular basis, and the first one will be held in Beijing, China at the China International Festival for Theatre for Children this summer.

Also, China National Theatre for Children in Beijing, a central theatre from ASSITEJ China, has reached the 60th anniversary of the foundation. To commemorate it, their festival in summer will be expanded and our first China-Korea-Japan Festival is going to be held within it, in which there will be an international symposium inviting international guests to discuss the works from Korea, China and Taiwan after watching them. A performance from Japan will be opened one week earlier.

And in Korea, there was also a new move; Jonngno Children's Theater, a theatre specializing in performances for children has been opened, and Ms. Kim Sookee, President of ASSITEJ Korea, became the Artistic Director. For theatre for children and young audiences whose history is not necessarily long, it is an epoch-making event.

Lastly, in Japan, a new organization has been born, due to the collaboration of 6 organizations in the field of theatre for children and young audiences, called TYA Japan. The purpose of this organization is to collect individual members related to and specialized in theatre for children and young audiences in Japan, and by establishing this organization, we are planning to hold an Asian Festival in 2018 and to host the ASSITEJ World Congress in 2020 in Japan. In Asia where traditional theatre and traditional performing arts still exist, we'd like to create an opportunity to think about the possibilities of theatre for children and young audiences.

ASSITEJ - UNIMA Agreement

ASSITEJ President, Yvette Hardie, was invited to attend the 22nd UNIMA World Congress and World Puppet Festival in San Sebastian and Tolosa from 28 May to 5 June 2016. At this historic meeting, she was able to discuss ideas with current leadership and members of UNIMA, and on the 4th day of the Congress, reelected UNIMA President Dadi Pudumjee and Yvette were able to make a public announcement that they would find ways to work together more collaboratively as International Associations. There is a commitment to developing the details of this collaboration in the next term of UNIMA and to finding ways to synergise better and support one another, on the basis of shared values.

The wording of the commitment reads: We commit in principle and in practice to collaboration and cooperation between our associations on matters of mutual interest, where appropriate. We do this in order to advocate the theatre and the arts as a universal expression of humankind, as fundamental to human, social and cultural development, and as a bridge-builder for mutual understanding and tolerance as enshrined in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.



ITI (International Theatre Institute) and AITA/IATA (International Amateur Theatre Association) have already committed to this collaboration, and ASSITEJ is in discussion with IDEA (International Drama/Theatre and Education Association), IATC (International Association of Theatre Critics) and OISTAT (International Organisation of Scenographers, Theatre Architects and Technicians) to collaborate as well.

We believe that at this time, working together, synergising efforts and creating a stronger advocacy for the role of the arts in the lives of every human being through using our collective voices is tremendously important.

One of the concrete ideas under discussion is to create a Performing Arts Week, which incorporates the 20-27 March, is celebrated annually and universally, and would include the World Day for Theatre for children and young people (ASSITEJ - 20 March), World Puppetry Day (UNIMA - 21 March) and World Theatre Day (ITI and IATA/AITA - 27 March) in such a way that these distinct individual celebrations would not be lost, but that there could be a greater momentum towards which we can all contribute for the notion of theatre/performing arts as central to our birth right as human beings.

ASSITEJ thanks Dadi Pudumjee (UNIMA President) and Idoya Otegui Martinez (newly elected UNIMA Secretary General), as well as outgoing Secretary General, Jaques Trudeau, for their interest in pursuing this collaboration.





International Projects and events for ASSITEJ Azerbaijan




May was memorable with International Projects and events for ASSITEJ - Azerbaijan National Center.

ASSITEJ Azerbaijan took part in the "Guest Yard"– VIII International Theatre Festival on May 27 in Orenburg, Russian Federation.

Another delegation of State Theatre of Young Spectators was on tour in London on May 28 invited by "UMUD Ltd Company" in the UK.

June will be memorable with one more International event for ASSITEJ Azerbaijan participating in the X International Summer Theatre School that is organized by the Russian Union of Theatrical Figures and Ministry



of Culture of Russian Federation.

In total around 87 delegates from more than 28 countries are going to attend the summer school during June 1-28. The summer school will be held in Zvenigorod, Moscow region and the delegates will come from USA, UK, Germany, Azerbaijan, France, Poland, and all over Russia.

Theaterwelt 13 June - 10 July, Mexico City.

Theaterwelt is a series of staged readings held every two years. A window to the contemporary theatre in Germany, Switzerland and Austria. This year, 2016, the event has been included in the schedule of the Mexico-Germany Dual Year. The plays were selected from the most recent German-speaking theatre productions.

The name symbolizes our pursuit and



interest in understanding the Germanic culture. Theatre-world-theatre; and is comprised of staged readings from the authors of greater importance in the theatrical scene of this culture, as well as workshops given by personalities of the German theatre, taking thus the opportunity to learn and confront the idea of Mexican theatre with that of these European countries. On this particular issue, the companies invited to work on the readings were those whose research and aesthetic discourses can result in a fresh and original interpretation of the texts.

This year is the fifth edition of Theaterwelt, and for the first time in this series, which ends on July 10, there will be two readings of children's plays: *Only One Day*, by Martin Balscheit, with the company Finisterra Project and *Three Head*, by Carsten Brandau, with the Company Oniria.

The project is organized by the Fine Arts
Institute, with the support of the Goethe Institut Mexiko.

21 years after the Rwanda Genocide that shocked the world, impressive grass root



movements have come up to aid in the country's recovery and peace building processes. One of the most promising of such is the Ubumuntu Arts Festival.

The Genocide against the Tutsi ethnic group started on the 7th of April 1994 and lasted for 100 days and saw over 1,000,000 dead. Each year since, Rwanda holds a 100 day commemoration period in which genocide perpetrators give testimonies and victims tell their stories. Public performative arts form part of the commemoration activities and have played a big role in seeing victims forgive perpetrators.

Press release

The reaction regarding the results of the *Call for Applications for Funding and Co*financing of Projects in the Field of Theatrical Creativity and Interpretation for 2016 of the *Ministry of Culture and Information of Republic of Serbia*

Decisions of the Commission appointed by the Ministry of Culture on the allocation of funds for financing and co-financing of projects in the fields of contemporary art for the 2016 published in May of this year, sparked strong reactions among the actors of the arts scene in Serbia. ASSITEJ Serbia was amongst the first to publish its statement in the series of reactions from various associations and organizations that express a strong protest against further collapse of the cultural scene in Serbia, which is already too shaky.

We believe that the distribution of a large amount of funding and support to a few projects only, selected by the Commission, predicts a uniformed, monotonous, limp and non-inventive scene. We wonder who (and why) strives to crumbles the diversity of the art scene without the presence of a range of various projects, without innovative and vibrant theatre that inspires, without the live theatre that responds to the time in which we live and offers new perspectives on the challenges that our society, particularly children and young people, is facing today.

African Youth Theatre and Dance Festival 2016 21 - 24 June



The second edition the African International Youth Theatre and Dance Festival will bring together African youth between 16 and 21 years for an inspired creative encounter which celebrates art forms as a contribution to youth empowerment, and develops these forms towards Cradle of Creativity, the 2017 ASSITEJ World Congress and International Theatre Festival for Children and Young People to be held in Cape Town.

This year the festival's focus is on developing critical thinking and writing about theatre and dance. It will feature performances of plays and dance for youth and a residency for young people in Cape Town, with workshops, discussions and performances. The programme will see professional theatre makers and journalists engaging with youth over the week and introducing them to various theatre and dance techniques and developing their capacity to think and write about the work. An important outcome will be a team of "Young Critics" with growing capacity and awareness of radio, print, and social media arts criticism and review.

XIX Premio ASSITEJ España de Teatro para la Infancia y la Juventud

In order to arouse greater interest for quality theatre, ASSITEJ Spain announces the XIX ASSITEJ Spain Award of Theatre for Children and Youth.

Authors of any nationality may participate, with the requirement that the works are written in Castilian and adapted to the theatrical genre, as well as to a young audience.

The theme, structure and number of characters are totally free of choice. Moreover, the work must be unpublished and not have been awarded nor presented in other competitions.

Each participant can submit up to two works, which will be sent by email to premiosteatro@assitej.net in PDF format and with a minimum length of 30 foolscap sized sheets.

A single prize of \le 2,500 along with a commemorative trophy for the best work presented to the jury, will be awarded.

In addition, the winning work will be published by the Association within their own Theatre Collection, while the author will retain all rights to the text.

The deadline for applicants to submit their writings is **October 30, 2016**, and the jury will make its decision public before February 10 next year.

For the first time **Interplay**, the international network organization for the furtherance of young playwrights, will have their bi-annual workshop in a Nordic country, and the focus will be on playwriting for young audiences. Hosts of this year's Interplay are **ASSITEJ Sweden** and **Barnteaterakademin** (Children's Theatre Academy, based in Gothenburg) that just celebrated its 10th anniversary of promoting new writing for TYA.

35 participants from all over Europe will meet in Ljungskile on the Swedish West Coast to discuss their plays for inspiring, practical and creative days of lectures, workshops, forums and events with experienced international tutors. Through workshops and small scale productions they have the opportunity to improve their work and develop new skills.

The Role of the Puppet in making early years theatre

Imaginary Leaps creative director reflects on the role of the puppet in making early years theatre and its importance in finding ways to communicate effectively with children:

For the past 5 years whilst resident in Western Australia, I have been exploring the world of puppetry and play with children of all ages. At the heart of my work with Imaginary Leaps play research workshops, is a creative open learning process, child-led, with active learning through puppetry, innovating original theatrical material with and for young children. The sessions explore sensory materials and objects, with music and movement, to stimulate imaginative play, engaging the children as participants and audience in a process of creating characters, stories and mini-worlds. Our aim is to go on an adventure - a journey of investigation with the children, to support and develop their imaginations and learning, which creates interesting ideas and material for early years theatre making.



'There is a fragile border between play and theatrical dimension' (Frabetti, 2009)

In an Imaginary Leaps session, the puppet is the focus, to begin an investigative framework of activities, scaffolding different sensory play techniques within a theme or story. Sitting in a circle to make a clear space, provides focus for the puppet and welcome's everyone in a secure routine. Bobby is a soft, tactile child puppet where characteristic gestures and features

are only gently suggested so the children's own imaginations can imprint what they want to see. Simple eyes and a curved line for a mouth, allows the child the freedom to 'fill in the gaps', changing its expression in the eyes of the child. Bobby is non verbal, and built to be touched and embraced, as required by the child, and can be any gender or culture. The puppet helps the children find their own confidence, role and identity through play.

Over the sessions, most children build a strong bond with Bobby and every child has their own relationship with the puppet. As they get to know the puppet in the sessions, they often spontaneously show affection when they say hello, enjoying expressing how they feel to the puppet, even if that is sometimes a punch! I remind them that Bobby is a real baby puppet, gathering him up and modelling comforting. . 'He is just a little puppet, How do we treat babies?' I ask them. At Kulunga Aboriginal Kindergarten in Western Australia the children answered 'We kiss them, we hug them, we play peek a boo, and we are gentle.' Very often children will discipline the other children, if they feel they are not treating the puppet well. At Kulunga, the puppet Bobby provided a strong focus to discuss how we treat each other. Children were able to have a safe space to communicate and this opens up a line of communication for discussion on how we should treat each other respectfully.

Children practise all skills through rhythmic repetition and it is through play that children imitate adults. Puppets and people alike need tender care. This gives space to talk about emotions simply, and the children express to the puppet how they feel today. We talk about the different feelings, are we happy or sad? or more complex emotional states. Bobby the puppet listens to a 4 year-old girl expressing her feelings, she says she feels 'tickly inside'. 'She's not right' she says in the third person, echoing her parents' voice, as she has been unwell previously.



Puppetry has a 'distancing effect'. Just as Rod Hull was never blamed for his puppet emu's bad behaviour, a young person can make a puppet say and do things which they would feel unable to do. This allows children to express what they truly feel and gives a greater understanding of how to meet their needs. The affirmation that the child is able to communicate with other children, other people, through the puppet increases self-esteem and confidence.

Working in creating theatre for young children, we always starts with the objects & materials in their hands. Later on, the objects and materials may be made into fabricated puppets but to begin it is a process of experiences with the children. To learn what is appropriate and engages the very young child. Throughout history, children have made simple models of people. Scraps of cloth, bits of wood and stones come alive and are animated.



Puppetry in its play and making theatre, is an activity that provides sensory stimulation simultaneously for intellectual and emotional development. In practice, for the participants in the sensory play, it brings the human basic feeling of oneself, a feeling of one's unique value, coming from deeply inner fields of their own personality, not from external incentives or awards. But it is a great experience for all, children and adults, to become participant and

'Theatre is transformation. It is a vision created by an artist...transforming...himself or a puppet or even an object into an imagined character' (Jurkowski,1988)

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
