

Global events that are shaking the world, universal topics of social inequality and inequality in general, the infinite row of images revealing the crude faces of capitalism, these are today's topical issues. The young of course feel these mounting problems that are threatening their future. The questions that the artists are facing are how to overcome these issues and whether it is utopian to believe that working with youth art can affect tomorrow and contribute to a better world.

We in ASSITEJ Serbia are happy to see thINTRODUCTIONat the programmes that we were preparing for quite some time with our partners from around the world are matching with the concept of this festival, known for discovering and bringing innovations in performing arts. It is thrilling to be a part of this internationally renowned festival, whose 2016 title "On the back of a raging bull" referring to the myth of Europe is countered with the title of Bitef Polyphony's 2016 programme "Resisting Rage" http://festival.bitef.rs/sideprogramme/.

The title "Resisting Rage" calls for the pursuit of the answer to the question whether the guiding principle of numerous artists in TYA of "making our audience more ready and active for a better world" is a utopia. Whatever the final answer is, artist should respond to the needs of society and, at the same time, be aware and responsible to (re)act. Already these regional, joint initiatives are making a substantial progress. But, the picture needs to be seen it its entirety, as only when you perceive it globally, and not solely in fragments, you can see it crystal clear. The last large ASSITEJ gathering On the Edge in Birmingham was followed by many reactions and reports illustrating the great motivation generated from this event. Among many ongoing calls for participation in various programmes, discussions, competitions and other events to be held in the upcoming CRADLE OF CREATIVITY 19th ASSITEJ World Congress & Performing Arts Festival in May 2017 I would like to stress again the importance of each and every voice bringing new ideas, experiences and points of view to these events.

I urge you to engage in the current activities, to apply, to recommend other excellent authors from your regions. It is of outmost importance that we all meet each other, to build our common picture of the world together, to continue to explore the possibilities and to share our knowledge and

ASSITEJ Artistic Gathering 2016 On The Edge - UK'S World Festival of Theatre for Young Audiences Hailed a Success

- 400 delegates from 51 countries across 5 continents attended the festival
- 160 artists from 25 companies, presented 16 productions and 9 works in progress
- \bullet Week long festival took place in 13 venues, with 91 performances attracting an audience of 9,500
- Festival programme also featured 56 symposium events with over 100 speakers

The 2016 ASSITEJ Artistic Gathering and World Festival of Theatre for Young Audiences

- ON THE EDGE - has been hailed a success. The event, held in Birmingham and hosted by the UK and Ireland for the first time, attracted over 400 delegates from 51 countries and featured a programme of 91 performances plus 56 symposium events. From 2 to 9 July an estimated audience of 9,500 people watched some of the best theatre for young people from around the world.

ON THE EDGE, which was sponsored by HSBC, brought the best and most imaginative international theatre for children, young people and their families to the city. Featuring 16 productions by 25 companies totalling 160 artists from 14 countries, including the UK, Ireland, Belgium, Burkina Faso, Australia and South Korea, the festival took place in 13 different theatre spaces across 8 Birmingham venues, with Birmingham Repertory Theatre as the main festival hub.

The title of the 19th ASSITEJ World Congress and Performing Arts Festival is the 'Cradle of Creativity', based in Africa for the first time in ASSITEJ history. Welcoming everyone back to the cradle of humanity, this event will profile Africa's best in theatre for children and youth, alongside performances from other continents.

ASSITEJ was first created because of a desire for intercultural collaboration during the period of the cold war. In the 21st century, this desire for collaboration across borders, languages, ethnicities, and personal histories seems more urgent than ever.

This magazine to be published in 2017 calls for articles that:

- Develop and illustrate intercultural exchange, collaboration, social change, diversity, and transformation in TYA:
- Examine connections between traditional/contemporary and local/global theatrical practices in TYA;
- Discuss the merits and disadvantages of intercultural exchange with regards to globalization, artistry, power, cultural norms and values in TYA.

Articles should

• Be between 500-700 words maximum and sent in Word and PDF (both), Times 12pt font.

- Include a title and the name of the author at the top, and a 25 word bio of the author at the end.
- All files should be named by last name of author and country.
- Submissions should be in English and in the original language of the author.
- Be accompanied by high quality photos in separate files from the article, TIFF preferred but JPEG is acceptable:

TIFF - size of the photo should not be less than 5 MB. IPEG - Non compressed, 300 DPI - 14 x 21 cm (8 1/2 x 5 1/5 inches).

Photos should be credited with name of photographer, company, and play.

Holidays in the archive - a visit from Poland

Sometimes people do things, which seem completely incomprehensible for others. Collecting spiders, taking ice baths or passing the entire days in front of the computer's screen playing video games are included. I am particularly absorbed by theatre for children and young audiences, which is not a popular and seriously taken interest in Poland where I come from.

Poland has been a member of ASSITEJ for decades and we have a great tradition of puppet theatre, which due to historical purposes (over 40 years of communism and socialist realism) is equating with YTA (nowadays this situation is slowly changing). In our history have appeared many outstanding theatre artists like Krystyna Miłobędzka and Leokadia Serafinowicz (from Teatr Marcinek in Poznań); Jan Dorman (who set up his theatre in Będzin); Halina and Zbigniew Machulski (Teatr Ochoty in Warsaw) whose work was dedicated to children and young people. Thanks to an outsized work of Children's Art Centre in Poznań plenty of new plays for young audiences have already been written and theatre for babies and the youngest children is well known here. Despite the fact that this list is not complete, TYA's position is not as high as it is in Germany. Neither there is a comprehensive bibliography dedicated to this topic, nor is TYA an area of interests for universities.

Last winter for the first time in my life I had heard about Natalie's Saz work and I realized how limited my knowledge in the area of TYA's history was. Then I decided to learn something more and I was told the Central Archive of ASSITEJ in KJTZ is the best place for the prospecting. Well... it really is!

However I had had an inkling of what ASSITEJ was, just after I read the history of this association (which is a great work of Nat Eek) and I looked through the "Théâtre enfance et jeunesse" magazine I understood the magnificence of the association. In the international library I found the great historical books written by Manon von de Water and interesting International Guide to Children's Theatre and Educational Theatre edited by Lowell Swortzell. The Central Archive is a perfect place for both research about contemporary and historical YTA in Germany, Europe and the worldwide. Especially the collection of the German one is impressive. Hundreds of thousands of books, scripts, magazines, theatre programs, audio and video recordings, pictures and posters – they are put in order in a few rooms at three levels and dr. Jürgen Kirschner who is responsible for the collection seems to know everything about every little piece of paper which can be found here.

Frankfurt am Main is charming modern city where grey herons, egyptian geese and rabbits live in the parks, and where I spent 10 days of my holidays reading and discussing books and documents of YTA, surrounded by inspiring people from KJTZ who do a great work for spreading magnificent ideas.
