Congress Registration

Registration for the Congress will be open at the **end of January 2017**, with **Early Bird registration through February (10% discount)**. The Programme will also be

announced at this time.

For registration purposes, different TYPES OF DELEGATES have been identified:

- Cradle delegates: For those wanting to participate in all aspects of the event: the Congress, Conference and Festival, and attending the entire event
- Congress delegates: ASSITEJ members (official delegates to General Assembly) and observers to Congress
- Conference delegates: For delegates to the ITYARN Conference
- Focus Day delegates: For delegates only attending one or more Focus Days
- Festival delegates: For delegates who only want to attend the festival performances, social events etc.
- Artist delegates: For artists who are IN productions performing at the festival

There will be three LEVELS OF DELEGATES, each with their own special rates:

- · International Delegates
- Developing Countries Delegates (as defined by the World Bank)
- · Student Delegates

Each registered delegate will receive a code which entitles them to a certain number of theatre tickets, which can be booked online. However, delegates will be free to also book for additional theatre performances as their programme allows.

Once registered, delegates can attend most events (not performances) on a first-come, first-served basis. However to have guaranteed entry to events, it is recommended that you register correctly for those events.

Accommodation: Cradle of Creativity

There have been many queries about accommodation in Cape Town next year. The website is now carrying information about the hotels that we will be using for delegates, and the other options available. For those people on a budget, backpacker's hostels and airbnb options are also available. It would be preferable for delegates to stay in the City Bowl, in walking distance of the main venues, Artscape and City Hall. Site inspection Cape Town

For the first time in ASSITEJ's 50 years of history we will have a conference in Africa. This fact is full of meaning and reflects the development and evolution of our association. After a fruitful EC meeting in Yaoundé, Cameroon, I traveled to Cape Town, South Africa along with our president, Yvette Hardie, from November 19 – 23. The visit was within the ASSITEJ protocols, previous to the 19th ASSITEJ World Congress and International Theatre Festival for Children and Young People, Cradle of Creativity.

During my visit I was able to get to know the city of Cape Town and its surroundings a little. Cape Town, in the Cape of Good Hope has a privileged location, nestled among a mountain range, home to the largest variety of wildflowers, and a turquoise blue sea with sandy white beaches. It is a modern city with some historical vestiges like The Castle. In the company of Jacqueline Domisse, artistic director of the Festival, Thiru Naidoo from WESGRO, Yvette and other members of the production team we toured different places, sites and theatres to get an overview of where the various activities of the Festival, Congress and General Assembly will take place.

Artscape, Baxter Theatre Centre, City Hall, the hubs in Vrygrond, Langa and Themba Labantu, the District Six Museum and other places they have selected all seem very appropriate venues and show diversity within their characteristics and fine facilities, which will allow international activities to take place in good conditions. At the same time they offer a broad spectrum of the infrastructure and the desire to make all the sectors of South African society participants of this event. This, in my opinion, will be a very inspiring experience for our international community.

I was very pleased to meet the people who make up the great work team for ASSITEJ South Africa, the CEOs, technical and administrative heads of some of the main venues and theatres, and the artistic directors of the Inauguration Ceremony an African show. I was also able to verify a good organization, additional to a warm, friendly and kind treatment. These last two characteristics are very important when speaking about artists, theatre, children, their families, communities and international delegations that will be participating with the purpose of going One Step Beyond Intercultural Exchange. The organization for this Congress is a very big challenge in many ways, but I was able to confirm that all the conditions are well met.

The interesting thing about ASSITEJ Congresses and International Festivals taking place in different parts of

the world is that they allow us to learn about the diverse contexts in which the activity we so love, theatre for children and young people, occurs. The planning that our colleagues are engaged in will enable all of us to participate actively in the General Assembly, where important decisions will be taken regarding ASSITEJ's next three years of work. We will address and reflect upon the theme of Intercultural Exchange from different platforms and points of view. We will enjoy the Festival Cradle of Creativity, where we will be able to see the best shows for young audiences in the world, a good number of co-productions as well as a great selection of performances from South Africa and other parts of the African continent.



Next generation workspace 2017/2018

International Research Residency, Theatre for Young Audiences in Frankfurt







theatre for young audiences. International theatre makers, independent artists from the region as well as students of the Hessian Theatre Academy (HTA) interested in working in this field are invited to attend the festival Starke Stucke (02 – 14 March 2017) as a group. Subsequently, they can then continue exploring artistic inquiries of their own in residency in July 2017 and February 2018, followed by the chance to present (partial) results at Starke Stucke 2018.

Next Generation workspace

The research residency is divided into three phases and aims to encourage young theatre makers to more intensely explore the field of "Theatre for Young Audiences" against the backdrop of their own artistic practices. During a collective visit to the festival, all invited artists will be asked to formulate issues and questions together based on the viewing of select productions. The results of the group discussions will serve as a basis for the further exploration and practical examination of the materials and formulated lines of inquiry during the subsequent residency phase. The next generation workspace is designed to be an experimental lab open to active contribution and reformulation by its participants. All residency artists are invited to share their practical-artistic experience, methods of reflection and working processes with the group. The goal is to transition from a discussion of select festival productions and the reflection of personal work experience, approaches and positions in small groups on the subject of "Theatre for Young Audiences" to an artistic process. In this process, participants can engage in an open-ended exploration of personal research interests, specific topic or individual artistic formats. In 2018, participants will have the chance to open their research processes during the festival and to invite the public to take part in it.

6th International Workshop on
Shadow and Shadow Theatre
"The Soul of Things"
May 15 - June 2, 2017, Piacenza, Italy





Many are the visual artists who nowadays use shadow as a privileged instrument of expression. However, we are no longer referring to pictorial shadow as seen through the development of the history of art but of a real shadow, which materializes in front of the spectator through projection apparatuses, which translate three-dimensional reality into a shadow representation.

This shadow is, from many points of view, like the one which began to appear on the contemporary shadow theatre scene over the last thirty years, when this art form began to revolutionize its apparatuses, break away from a fixed screen and explore new ways of using space, light and the body-object.

The soul of things workshop considers the recent experiences regarding shadow in the field of the visual arts and aims to identify their similarity and differences to shadow theatre. It also reflects on

how the latter can learn from and adopt some of this experimentation, both technically and with regard to "dramaturgy".

ASSITEJ Korea's yesterday, today and tomorrow

Since our 13th annual winter festival is approaching (4th - 14th of January, 2017) and many international guests must be busy with adjusting already cramped schedules to squeeze, why don't we remind all members about the impressive development of ASSITEJ Korea?



ASSITEJ Korea opened its door relatively early in 1982 and the very next year it managed to acquire an official membership status. Needless to say, there was a record to cite saying about the existence of children's plays as well as plays for young audience even before 20th century. However, in the early stages, those plays were rather commercialized and one-sided as a mere branch of plays for grown-ups. It was in the 1980s when children's plays grew in number as well as in quality with more educational or artistic approaches and this trend led to the establishment of ASSITEJ Korea.

Since the establishment, we can divide our short history into three periods: the first (1982-1992), the

The Seminar and National Encounter of Performances for Teenagers, from the state of Hidalgo, was also analyzed. It is an academic program that seeks to professionalize and develop new poetics in theatre, dance, performance and performing arts directed to young audiences.

the community, analyzed, debated and found intersections in the different scenic proposals coming from the country, which, without a doubt, helped to enrich the national scenic spectrum in young audiences.

6th Europe 8+ Network Meeting in Belgrade,
Serbia



From 28th to 30th November representatives from Austria, Croatia, Italy, Hungary, Romania and Serbia gathered in Belgrade for the 6th Europe 8+ network meeting of regional ASSITEJ centers, hosted by ASSITEJ Serbia. During the two days of intensive and fruitful program, participants discussed ideas for joint regional projects, plans and further steps for the Europe 8+ network.

The program included a meeting of the representatives of ASSITEJ centers with ASSITEJ Serbia members, representatives of institutional theaters and individual members who are particularly focused on inclusion and dance in TYA Serbia. Participants from Serbia presented the majority of productions and capacities of Serbian TYA to our guests from the region, thereby offering them an insight on the current situation in the field. It was particularly interesting to see the serious differences existing between institutional and non-institutional theaters in Serbia. However, their presentations have also shown that both are facing several important and common problems, which can be overcome through the development of joint programs. On the other hand, Serbian participants had a chance to learn about the structure of ASSITEJ national centers from the region, their programs, festivals and theatres, through the presentations given by participants from the region.

The 9th International Competition of Young Opportunity Dance Performers OPUS 1 Short dance piece 2017 Slovenian National Theatre Celje April 15, 2017

Open to dancers born between 1993 and 2002, who can apply with:

- · A solo dance piece which is both conceived and choreographed by the performing dancer
- A duet, which is both conceived and choreographed by the performing dancers shared authorship

Dancers who apply should live outside of Slovenia. Dancers living in Slovenia should reach the international competition through national contests.

The organiser of the competition publishes a theme every year that the young dance performers must use as a basis for their short dance piece. In December we are finishing our year-long project "Shadowland" - a project were we have investigated and discussed the topic of racism and racist structures in performing arts for children and youth. Have performing arts for young people embraced these issues? Are they mirrored in our repertoires? Do our performances raise questions or encourage resistance?

By encouraging collaboration between companies and institutions in Sweden and in other European countries we have exchanged knowledge, competence and experience, we have worked for the strengthening of artistic work and we have, hopefully, encouraged performing arts for young people to counteract racism.

Since the beginning of the project we have organized 9 seminars/workshops, 7 workshops with teenagers, invited 6 performing arts productions from abroad to Sweden and organized a dance residency. We have cooperated with partners in Norway, Denmark, Germany, Netherlands and USA.

It's been our desire and aim that performing arts for youth should not only be an arena for exciting and creative innovation in the arts, but also a champion for positive social and cultural change, a counterweight to racism and ethnocentrism and an inspiration to democratic development.

Silence, sounds, secrets, surprise Happy New Ears, 20 - 22 Mannheim / Germany

November 2016 in the German city of Mannheim, not so far from Frankfurt where ASSITEJ Germany has its office.

We – about 150 people who are interested in music theatre for young audiences - have received an invitation to listen: *Happy New Ears* labels an international festival of contemporary music theatre for young audiences and a congress with a focus on experiments in this field. The festival explores a variety of forms, music, theatrical spaces and aesthetic choices in German and European music theatre for young audiences. Several productions address children as young as six months, only one dares to create opera for youngsters aged 14 and up.



Artists and experts from several countries have come to Mannheim to listen and see, to present and perform and to challenge traditional ideas of what music theatre might be within the German theatre system. The congress takes the festival programme as an impulse to discuss the idea of experiments. Charlotte Seither, representative of the composers' association defines an experiment as a permanent search, an impetus for change, a questioning of power relations and hierarchies, a movement that aims at changing society by changing something within those performing and those listening. Her statement was made at the very end of the conference, but could – and possibly should – have been an initial spark for a discussion about the political dimensions of the work we do, no matter whether it is presented on a big or small stage.

Already in her introduction to recent developments in music theatre for young audiences, Ina Karr, artistic director of the opera at the state theatre in Mainz, confirmed that despite a great variety of new works, forms, productions and competitions, it is yet too early to describe a change in paradigms. She emphasizes two aspects: The first is the focus on listening and on the ability to hear humans have already as babies. Hearing is constant. It gives us a sense of place and space, it can be filtered and focused. A rhythm or a beat can be felt and heard. All these processes need to be reflected in much more detail when producing a music theatre that asks us not only to hear but to listen, which aims to strengthen hearing as a sense which offers a multitude of access to our audiences. Secondly, Ina Karr, discussed the idea of intertextuality in music theatre for young audiences. This concept contains the possibility to combine different traditions of theatre, dance, music and visual arts. It also invites us to



explore new production processes and new ways of seeing musicians on stage. How do they present themselves as performers and musicians at the same time? How do they address an audience? How can the act of creating music be made visible and enjoyable? How can it become part of what is offered to the audience as an invitation to continue a musical dialogue?
